Publication Guidelines

Academic research involves several coordinated steps which includes: study design, experimentation/execution, data collection, research data analysis, and publication. During the process of translating the research datas into a publication, one must be aware of ethical code of conduct and other regulatory aspects to preserve academic integrity. At SIMATS, the Publication Peer Review Committee (PPRC) which ensures approval and consent, data accuracy, data falsification, plagiarism, ethics of authorship and conflict of interest.

Undergraduate students, Postgraduate students, Ph.D. Scholars and Faculties at SIMATS actively publish scientific content in various peer-reviewed national and international journals. To channelize the academic, scientific integrity and negate plagiarism, SIMATS has an active scientific review board (SRB) for approving UG the UG and PG thesis research work. Students can select guides from respective research backgrounds and commit their research project under their supervision. The students are required to submit the SRB form prior to the initiation of the research project. The students are required to obtain ethics approval (if involving human/animal subjects), informed consent from patients and ensure data confidentiality. The consent forms must commit on protection of patients' personal identity and other confidential data (e.g., socioeconomic status). In addition, the consent forms must include patient rights clearly in a language understandable by patients. Upon approval by the SRB, students can initiate the project successfully.

Completion of project and culminating it into a research paper is also monitored by the Research Supervisor and SRB. Peer Reviewer Evaluation Board at SIMATS ensures manuscript quality and suitability according to the journal of choice. Plagiarism, data integrity, ethics with authorship is also assessed and ensured by the SRB. The University expects that students and faculties to ensure academic integrity and practice exemplary scholarship. While submitting any assignments, presentations, proposals, thesis, papers it is expected that the student who is submitting will ensure that it is his/her own work, they will acknowledge the work of other sources that they have borrowed from, and make it explicit who they have consulted in completing their work. Authorship guidelines ensures that, the Guide to be the corresponding author and student to be the first author in the submitted manuscript. Other contributing authors must be properly included according to the contributing percentage and properly acknowledged prior to submission. Failure to acknowledge consultation, help, or sources are treated as plagiarism.

Plagiarism, data falsification or fabrication are serious offences and it will attract penalties including possible expulsion from the University. If thesis contains any of these offences, the degree can be withdrawn post graduation. If any of the published papers are blacklisted/withdrawn from Scopus, Web of Science or PubMed due to poor quality at any time during the duration of the Ph.D., no credit for blacklisted papers or journals will be provided. Publication over sight committee at SIMATS ensures all necessary precautions to evaluate journals prior to submission.
